



## Trail Closure Notice – Temporary

Posted on December 20, 2016

As of tomorrow morning (12/20/2016), we will be once again be temporarily closing the section of trail through the timber thinning area. This closure is expected to last about 2 weeks. I've been told that the current cleanup activities will not affect the trail, however, I have chosen to close it as a precautionary measure. The reason for this short closure is to clean up the logs that were left behind by the previous contractor. This will NOT complete the activity. We will reopen the trail once this area is cleaned and cleared and expect to re-close it again in late Spring for approximately 4 weeks.

(Editors Note: The impacted area is mile marker 209 to Highway 300 (MM209-211.5) or from near Lundsford corner and west of there for 2 miles.)

## Friends of the Ouachita Trail Completes Shelter Project

Ten years ago FoOT proposed completing a shelter system on the Ouachita Trail. The project called for adding 12 new shelters to the existing 9 on the OT. The new shelters would extend from Talihina, Oklahoma to highway 27 north of Mt. Ida.

After several years of clearing the necessary reviews by the U.S. Forest Service, in March of 2013 the first new shelter was completed just east of Foran Gap. It was dedicated to Mr. Art Cowley. Mr. Cowley was known as the father of the Ouachita Trail.

What seemed to be an overwhelming effort for FoOT, had begun. With the support of an amazing group of FoOT volunteers, the 12<sup>th</sup> shelter was completed on Suck Mountain, Friday, November 11<sup>th</sup>, 2016. In just over 3 ½ years, what had seemed difficult at best was now a reality.

Financial support from the Cowley family, FoOT members, and grants from Arkansas & Oklahoma provided the necessary funds to purchase supplies. Volunteers added to this support by providing all the necessary planning and labor. Hundreds of hours of work and travel time were given to the project. Many dollars were spent with gas and lodging in support.



An amazing group of people worked through heat & cold, rocks, heavy lifting, and overall tough conditions to construct these 12 new shelters. A special thanks to each person who contributed to this effort. The Ouachita National Recreational Trail shelter system is now complete.

## Ouachita Challenge 2017 Dates Announced

The Ouachita Challenge is the premier mountain bike race in Arkansas. On the weekend of March 25th and 26th, 2017, the Ouachita Challenge will be held for the 16th year. This 60 mile race covers portions of two IMBA Epic Trails, the Ouachita Trail and the Womble Trail. A Tour is held on Saturday and the Race is held on Sunday. Both events are limited to 250 riders and all spots are filled shortly after registration opens in December. This event is sponsored by the Ouachita Mountain Challenge Association. The proceeds from the event go to help the non-profit groups (Oden School, volunteer fire departments, ham radio club, FoOT, Traildogs, and others) who help to put on the tour and race. ## Friends of the Ouachita Trail Fall Report from President Bo Lea

Cooler weather is almost upon us and it is time look toward FoOT's busy time of the year. Since spring, all of Fourche Mountain from Eagle Gap at Mile Marker 58.5 to Turner Gap at Mile Marker 79.9 has been worked. In March, FoOT

volunteers along with the Texas Outdoors Group worked from Tan-E-Hill Gap to Turner Gap, almost 6 miles. In July FoOT VP of Maintenance, Ron Mayfield led a Texas Conservation Crew to work from Eagle Gap to Foran Gap, 10 miles. Fourche Mountain is a very rough section of trail to maintain due to the difficult access and terrain plus vegetation growth.

FoOT trail grant request from the Arkansas Highway Transportation Department was approved late in 2015. Funds were released recently and FoOT has ordered and received the last 3 log kits to complete the new 12 shelter project. The schedule for construction of the last 3 shelters is: Turner Creek - Sept. 27th, Suck Mountain - Oct. 18th, Story Creek - Nov. 8th. Dedication of the completed shelter system which includes the existing 9 on the east end will be in the spring. Contact us for details on the shelter project if you wish to participate.

Board members serve a three year term. Those elected this fall will serve 2017 through 2019 (with two additional terms allowed). During that time, you would be expected to attend three to four meetings a year, to help provide overall guidance to the organization, to participate in the election of our operating officers, and to approve and monitor our financial position.

Candidates for the Board positions must be identified by September 30th.

The Board elects the operating officers, which serve for the calendar year. Operating officers include the President, three Vice-Presidents (Maintenance, Membership, and Community Relations), and a Secretary / Treasurer. Candidates for officer positions must be identified by the end of the year December 31.
